*From the Desk of Mr. Zimmerly,*

The PAX Good Behavior Game is a behavior program that all elementaries are now using in West Holmes. PAX stands for peace, productivity, and happiness. The program is integrated into the daily routine and encourages students to self-regulate their behavior and emotions, as well as encourages them to be responsible for their own actions.

Here are three kernels that are a part of the PAX GBG that you can use at home and that the kids are familiar with.

**PAX Vision** - Take a few minutes to talk with your kids about what they would like to see more of at home. You as parents also share what you would like to see more of at home. For example, your child may say they would like more family time. You as parents may say that you would like your child to help keep their room clean. This would be a great conversation to have. More family time could be achieved as your children take more responsibility on keeping their room clean, because it frees up more time for you as a parent. Get a piece of paper and write these things down that each of you want to see more of. After you talk about what you want to see more of, talk about and write down things that you both would like to see less of. Keep an open mind and allow this to be good discussion together as a family.

**Beat the Timer** - Use your phone or a simple kitchen timer to have your children try to complete a task in a set amount of time. If they are able to beat the timer, then spend a few minutes doing something fun together.

**Tootles** - Tootles are notes that teachers write to students for doing something good. So, at home, say your child helps you get ready for supper, or clean their room, etc. cooperatively, or without being asked. Write a short note to them letting him or her know that you noticed what they did and appreciate it. Even a child sharing a toy with a sibling is something that you could write a tootle for.

I encourage you to try some of these things at home. Hopefully students will respond positively with the connection between home and school.

### West Holmes Kindergarten Screening

Parents with children who will be five or six years old on or before August 1, 2025, are asked to register their child at the West Holmes elementary school that the child will most likely be attending.

**February 3, 2025 – April 25, 2025**

Call the building secretary where your child will attend school. The building secretary will ask you for basic registration information about your child and sign your child up for a kindergarten screening appointment.

Once you have called and signed your child up for a screening appointment, you will receive an email explaining how to log onto the district website at [www.westholmes.org](http://www.westholmes.org) and click on the Final Forms link. From there you can complete the necessary forms to register your child. Please complete this process by Monday, May 5th.

**Before screening please download the following documents to Final Forms: your child's birth certificate, immunizations, proof of residency, and your photo ID so that we have all the necessary paperwork on file.**

\*If you bring your child to school or if they walk, please make sure they arrive to school no later than 8:40.

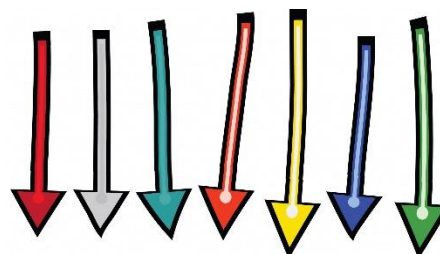
\*If you are picking your child up from school early, a phone call or note is required. **You may come in the building to sign your child out.**

\*Dismissal is at 3:30. We ask that you avoid picking them up early, unless you have a set appointment. All students should be in the bus/pick-up line by 3:40, making for a quick dismissal. The students will go to the east side of the building, near the main entrance, for dismissal. A staff member will not release them without visual confirmation as to who is picking them up. This is for the safety of our students.
