## Note From Tom Eastep, RN

All incoming 7th grade students are required to get a 1 dose booster of either Tdap or Td and a Meningococcal vaccine before starting the 2025-2026 school year.

In the last quarter, Mrs. Lance's 7th grade Language Arts classes will be making final preparations for the transition to 8th grade. We will focus on silent reading comprehension strategies and more sophisticated writing skills. We will use various short stories, fairy tales, poetry, and nonfiction selections to accomplish these goals. Readers Theater scripts will be used to improve fluency and expression in reading. We will also be examining practice test questions to review testing format and specific vocabulary in preparation for the upcoming state tests.

Mr. Dombrady's 7th grade math are continuing our probability unit before wrapping up with our final unit on rational numbers. After Spring Break, we will begin reviewing for the state test.

Mr. Dombrady's Algebra will continue with our polynomials and quadratic equations units from now until Spring Break. After break, we will be using graphing calculators to solve quadratic functions. Students do not need to purchase a graphing calculator.

Mr. Wengerd's 8th grade reading class is currently reading The Giver by Lois Lowry. We will finish the year with a few other novels, including Milkweed and The True Confessions of Charlotte Doyle.

Mr. Wengerd's 8th grade writing class is working on a Local History play currently. We will focus on Argumentative Writing prior to the state test.

During March and April, <u>Mrs. Doty's 7th grade accelerated math</u> students will continue working with geometry, including surface area and volume, in the upcoming weeks. We will then work with rational number operations before beginning to review for this year's State Test. Students can use Success Maker to help review concepts from throughout the year.

Mrs. Blankenship's 6th Grade Science is finishing up their Earth Science unit about Rocks, Minerals, Soil, and the Rock Cycle. We will finish the year learning about Physical Science topics such as Potential and Kinetic Energy while creating roller coasters.

Mrs. Blankenship's 8th Grade Science is finishing up their Earth Science unit learning about the History of the Earth along with Relative and Absolute Dating. We will finish the year on Life Science learning about Genetics and Heredity.

Mrs. McCluggage and Mrs. Downs: Students are working in their genre of choice in independent reading while we explore fantasy in class as we read A Wrinkle in Time by Madeleine L'Engle. This is a stark contrast to the nonfiction we just finished: Children of the Dust Bowl by Jerry Stanley. The contrast of style helps us discuss just how different writing can be. We also explore this contrast in different styles when we write. In writing, we finished writing historical fiction plays which will be used this spring to celebrate the bicentennial year of the formation of Holmes County. Next we will be working on formal argument writing.

Mrs Ogi's 7th graders are working with converting fractions, decimals and percents, as well as the percent proportion.

Mrs Ogi's 6th graders are adding and subtracting fractions with common denominators and without.

Mrs. Lowe's, Bible's and Doty's 6th grade math classes -Students are just finishing up percentages. Students worked on converting percents into decimals and fractions along with finding the percent of a number. Our next topic will cover geometry. We will be finding area, surface area, and volume of shapes. Students should be completing at least 60 minutes of Success Maker each week. This is the intervention piece of our new curriculum to assist in the spiral of previous math material.

In <u>Mrs. Rohr's Art</u> classes 6th graders will be creating shape collages. 7th graders will be painting a color wheel. 8th graders will be building clay boxes.

Mrs. Rennecker and Mrs. Snyder are finishing up the novel The Giver by Louis Lowry. We have been working on vocabulary and examining dialogue that propels the action of the plot, and different types of Irony in the story. When we finish this novel we will be working on tall tales and myths as we are also preparing for the state test. The students have been polishing up their writing abilities by using ACES and writing essays. They should be reading 20 minutes a night to help them reach their AR goal. This year is flying by and we are all working hard to get your child geared up for high school.

Mrs. Acker's Health – 6<sup>th</sup> graders will begin their final rotation. We will look at Health information, study the parts and functions of the skin, eye, ear, hair, nails and teeth. Our students will also participate in the Anti-Virus program for character development. 7<sup>th</sup> graders will study units including, tobacco information, alcohol risk behaviors and understand various drug categories and effects. We will finish with personal and weather safety. 8<sup>th</sup> graders will study nutrition, eating disorders, memorize the basic bones and joints in the skeleton and the Endocrine system, including the male and female reproductive system.

Mr. Ogi's 8th grade history class will be covering the first presidents of the United States over the next few couple months before finishing the year with the Civil War.

Mr. Ogi's 7th grade history class will be covering the Middle Ages and the Renaissance.

Ms. Lang's 6th Grade Science classes will be reviewing physical, Earth, and life science concepts. Holmes County Soil and Water as well as Holmes Wayne Electric will be sharing important information as well as guest parent presenters McConville, Morehouse, and Schafer.

#### Parents:

We have completed ¾ of the school year without any major issues, but I want to address a few areas before they become major issues. We cannot combat these issues alone.
