Weekend Happenings:

- **Thursday, May 8:**
 - Varsity Softball lost to Ashland 13-4. Zalina Proper had 3 of the team's 8 hits. Gabby Fowler, Briar Cline, Chloe Miller, Landrie Croskey, and Mari Patterson also had hits for the Lady Knights.
 - Varsity Baseball beat Ashland 7-4. Getting The Win On The Mound Was Morgan Smith, Throwing a Complete Game, Giving Up 0 Earned Runs On 9 Hits, 1 Walk, and Striking Out 6. Manny Camacho Swung a Hot Bat, Leading The Knights In Hits With 4, Followed By Morgan Smith With 2, And 5 Other Knights Added a Hit apiece. The Knights Improve To 10-6 On The Year.
 - JV Baseball lost to the Ashland Arrows 10-0 in seven innings on Thursday night. The Knights could only manage 3 hits (Quincy Camacho, Rayce Angle [double], and Easton Ross). Quincy Camacho, Calvin Pendlebury, Anderson Stryker, Shane Lorentz, Remy Beachy, and Ford Jones all pitched. The Knights drop to 2-7 in OCC play and 5-9 overall.
- **Friday, May 9:**
 - The Girls Varsity Track Team finished fifth in the Hudson Grand Prix Invitational with 59 points competing against some of the top Division 1 teams in NE Ohio on Friday. Many Season and personal bests galore highlighted the Knights first invitational in almost three weeks because

of the fickle Ohio weather. The Knights kicked off the evening battling N. Canton Glen Oak in the 4x800 relay, with each leg for West Holmes running season PRs in the relay to finish second with a 10 second improvement over their Knights Invitational race in 9:55.38. Racing in the 4x800 were Katherine Kaster, Noelle Smith, Zora Starner and Iriel Mena. Sophomore Mallory Marmet had another consistent evening in the throwing events, finishing 3rd in the Shot Put and 6th in the Discus on a breezy evening in Hudson. Senior sprinter Arora Chaney had fully automatic PRs in the 100 and 200 and led off the Knights 4x400 relay to help the WH tandem of Arora, Brinley Malachin, Breslyn Brown and Zora Starner finish in a season best PR. Casey Ogi battled some top NE Ohio vaulters and a sometimes gusty crosswind to finish 3rd in the Pole Vault in a season best 10'3" and had a couple good attempts at 10'6". Ninth grader Iriel Mena almost stole the show in the 3200 m run in the penultimate event of the night, coming close in the final 300 meters to the eventual winner (also a ninth grader) to score a third place overall in a season best and 2nd best time in WHHS history in the event. Senior Lexy Starner ran her season best in the 3200 run to finish 5th. Senior Noelle Smith finished fifth in the 1600 while junior Katherine Kaster was sixth in solid times despite a heavy breeze on the backstretch. The Knights are back in action on Tuesday for Senior Night.

- The Boys Varsity Track Team had many of their best performances of the 2025 season so far on Friday in their fifth place finish at the ultra-competitive Hudson Grand Prix Invitational with a mostly young squad, including numerous 9th and 10th graders. Notable performances included a PR by junior Owen Neville in the 3200 m run, a third place and new PR by 9th grader Rhett Chaney in the Long Jump, a PR by sophomore Maddax Graham in the Shot Put in addition to his best two event outings of the season with his near best in the discus. Also showing improvements and scoring was the 4x200 relay of Rhett Chaney, Reid Chaney, Marshall Yoder and Mac Craft and the 4x400

squad of Rhett, Reid, Marshall and Parker Garver. Parker also dropped a big time PR in the 800 meter run. The team will host Gilead Christian on Tuesday for Senior Night.

- Varsity Softball lost to New Philadelphia 9-0. The Lady Knights managed just 3 singles on the night. Zalina Proper had two singles and Emma Miller had the other single.
- JV Baseball beat the first place New Philadelphia Quakers in a 15-11 slugfest on Friday night. Keston McKinney threw a gutsy 5 1/3 innings in relief of Quincy Camacho and Calvin Pendlebury to earn the win. Quincy Camacho and Mason Parrett (two doubles) each had two hits to lead the offense. Remy Beachy (double), Shane Lorentz, Rayce Angle, Carson Horn, and Keston McKinney all had a hit. The Knights improved to 3-7 in OCC play and 6-9 overall.
- Varsity Baseball Fell To The Quakers By A Score Of 2-1 On Youth Night Taking His First Loss On The Mound Of The Year Was Manny Camacho. He Threw 4 Innings, Giving Up 2 Earned Runs On 1 Hit, 5 Walks and Striking out 6. Cooper Booth Threw 1 2/3 Innings, Allowing 1 Hit While Striking Out 2. Carson Tanner Threw 1 1/3 Innings, Giving Up 0 Hits and Striking Out 2. This Was A True Pitching Duel But The Quakers Kept The Upper Hand By Not Allowing a Hit Through All 7 Innings. The Knights Fall To 10-7 On The Year.

- Varsity Softball lost to Garaway 10-5. The Lady Knights had 10 hits, but only 5 runs in the game. Zalina Proper had a double and 2 singles, and Gabby Fowler and Briar Cline both singled twice in the loss. Landrie Croskey doubled and Emma Miller and Payton Hudson both singled. The team starts their Sectional tournament at home against Riverview on Tuesday at 5:00.
- Varsity Baseball lost to Norwayne 8-1. Taking The Loss On The Mound Was Cooper Booth, Throwing 3 1/3 Innings, Allowing 4 Earned Runs On

6 Hits, 3 Walks and Striking Out 4. Carson Tanner Threw 1 2/3 Innings, Giving up 2 Earned Runs On 6 Hits, 1 Walk and striking out 3. Colston Tenney Threw The Final Inning, Only Giving Up 1 Hit. Manny Camacho Led The Knights In Hits With 2, Followed By Brock Gallion With 1. The Knights Fall To 10-8 On The Year.

- JV Baseball defense squandered a late lead in their 11-9 loss to the Norwayne Bobcats on Saturday. Shane Lorentz (double), Rayce Angle, and Mason Parrett (2 doubles) each had two hits, with Remy Beachy, Quincy Camacho, Chris Williams (double), Easton Ross, and Preston Troyer each having a hit as well. Rayce Angle, Shane Lorentz, and Quincy Camacho all pitched on the afternoon. The Knights drop to 6-10 on the season.
